

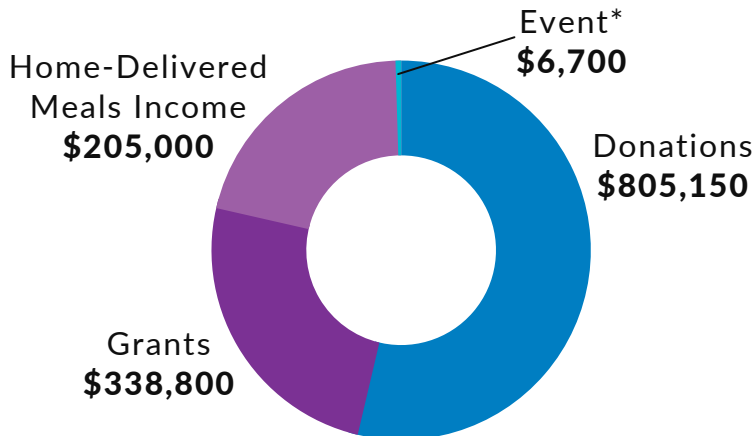

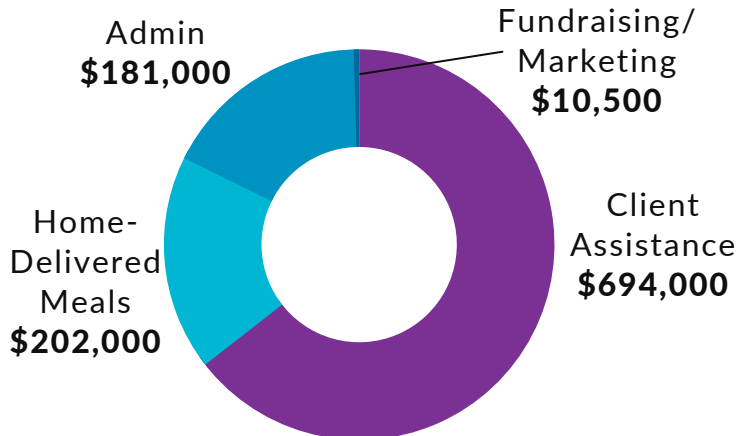
The **MISSION** of Eastern Area Community Ministries is to partner with people in need or crisis and to equip and support them in achieving life-long **stability** and **dignity**.

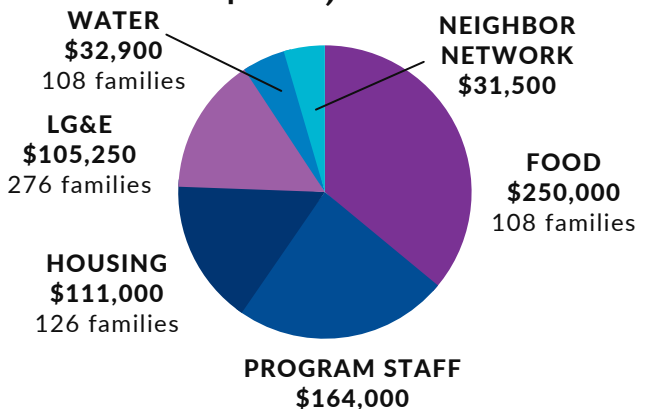
